
One of the most interesting research projects involving Morrow Co. history is one that could be termed "ROOTS In Reverse". Whereas Alex Haley traced ancestry to Africa, a native of Africa has traced an ancestor to our county.

Elmer Johnson, born in Liberia but living in Quincy, MA, identified his forefather as ABRAM SIMPSON, of Peru Twp. Abram, born ca. 1791 in Maryland, lived in N. Carolina several decades, then moved to Morrow Co. ca. 1848. Abram (a mulatto) owned 50 acres near Delaware Co., and lived with son John until he married secondly to a woman named Harriet, who was from Pennsylvania. Abram & Harriet had 6 children: Lorenzo, Riley, Sarah, Mary, Dalphena and Rachel. Abram died in 1863, intestate; all 6 children were named wards of LEVI WOOD. Wife Harriet and son John Simpson were not mentioned in Abram's estate proceedings.

John Simpson was in the Union Army in the Civil War, then moved to Florida. In 1879, John, his wife Julia (a cousin of Mary Todd Lincoln), and their 3 sons emigrated to Liberia. That family line became prominent in the government: grandson C. LORENZO SIMPSON, was Vice President in 1944, then Ambassador to the U.S., and later still, Ambassador to Great Britain.

Elmer Johnson, great great grandson of John Simpson, has lived in the U.S. since 1980. He wants to contact other descendants of Abram Simpson from the second marriage. Surnames would include SMITH & KIMBROUGH (as Dalphena married Nathaniel Smith; sister Rachel married Francis Kimbrough), as well as the SIMPSON surname.

The other disruption was the closing of the Genealogy Department of the Mt. Gilead Public Library. This section shares the 2nd floor room with office space of the library's clerktreasurer. When the clerk-treasurer resigned after 5 years of service, a detailed audit was needed before a new one could be hired. The entire room was taken over during the examination, limiting public access for research. A return to normalcy is expected by early February.
